


## **Rooster Coin**


Difficult: Medium high

Paper: Best with white/red sandwich paper 23x23 cm




1 - Start color side up.Crease the diagonals and the medians




2 - Crease the fourths. Return the model.




3 - Precrease a blintz base on the white side




4 - Make a windmill base




5 - Squash folds on all four layers




6 - Precrease a bird base on all four squares




6b - (Not mandatory). Unfold everything and precrease as shown




7 - Open sinks on all four corners & 8 inside reverse folds




8 - Result. Lift all flaps.




A1 - **Barbels**Fold the flap down as far as possible







A13 - Inside reverse fold




A14 - Mountain folds to smooth the edges




A15 - Mountain folds to smooth the edges




A16 - The barbel is completed




B1 - Crest Fold the flap down as far as possible, creating new creases




B2 - Refold the waterbomb base




B3 - Change the color by wrapping the layers




B4 - Intermediate step. Fold the layer down and squash fold.




B4 in progress. Unfold the waterbomb base while bringing the flap up and flatten




B5 - Result. Wrap one layer.




B6 - Fold the flap as far as possible and flatten. This step is similar to step B4.




B7 - Result. Squash fold.




B8 - Pull out the trapped layers of paper.




B9 - Squash fold.




B10 - Valley fold.






B12 - Crease the fold connecting the two edges. Unfold.






B16 - Fold the Iflap back down






B18 - Precrease the angle bissector






B22 - Pull out the loose paper to reduce the red area.




B23 - Pull out the trapped paper.




B24 - Inside reverse folds to shape the crest






B26 - Inside reverse folds to create an additional flap




B27 - Squash fold




B28 - Fold the flap down




B29 - Rearange the flaps.




B30- Inside reverse fold




B31 - Pleat to bring the tip on the paper edge






B33 - Swivel fold to create a small white triangle




B34 - Shift the layers a bit




B35 - Mountain folds to shape the crest




C1 - **Beak.** Fold the layer left as far as possible




C2 - Mountain fold




C3 - Unfold the layers




C4 - Crease the bissectors




C5 - Petal fold




C6 - Fold along the angle bissectors




C7 - Fold the flap using the creases made in step C1




C8 - Valley fold
