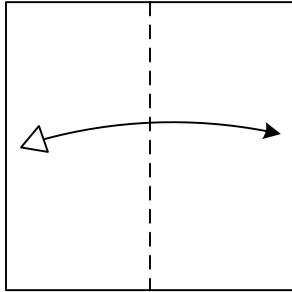
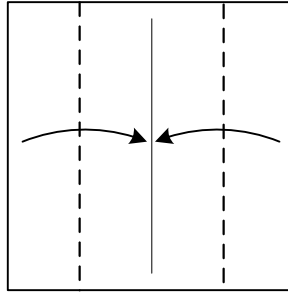


Princess

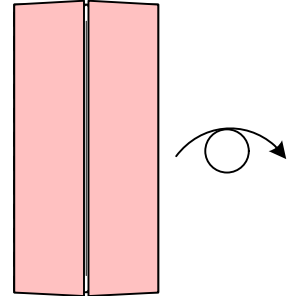

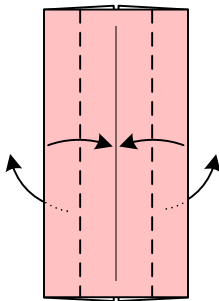
1. Fold and unfold the left edge to the right edge.



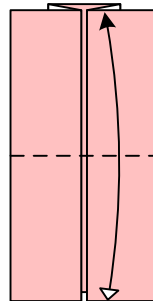
2. Fold the right and left edges to the center.



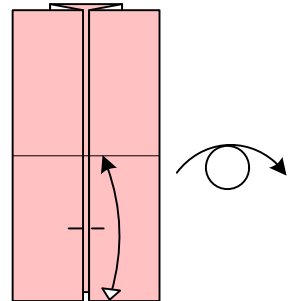
3. Turn the model over.



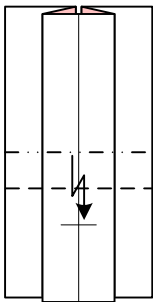
4. Fold the left and right edges to the center, allowing the rear flaps to swing around to the front.



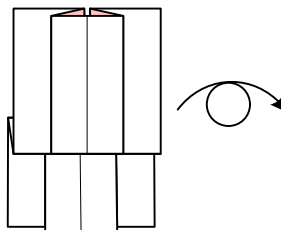
5. Fold and unfold the bottom edge to the top.



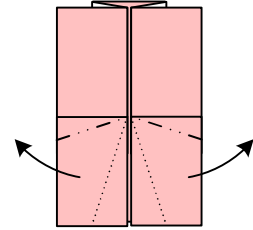
6. Make a pinchmark halfway between the bottom edge and the center. Then turn the model over.



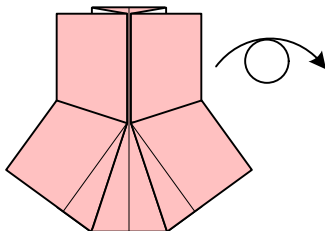
7. Pleat the model, bringing the center crease down to the pinchmark from step 6.



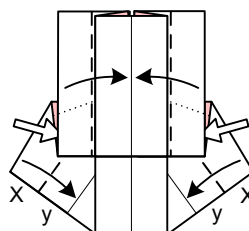
8. Turn the model over.



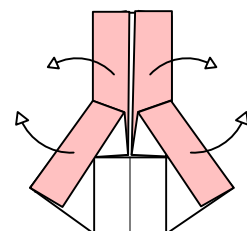
9. Swivel the lower near flaps outward, pivoting from the center, and re-crease in their new positions.



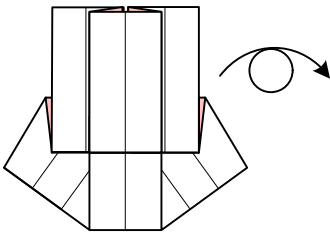
10. Turn the model over.



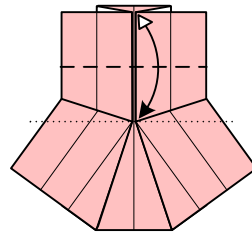
11. Fold the upper single layers to meet in the center. At the same time, squash the lower flaps to the positions in step 12. Edges x and y should align.



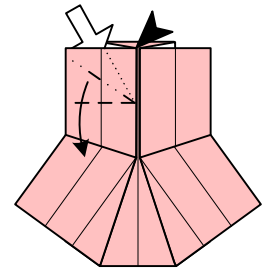
12. Unfold step 11.



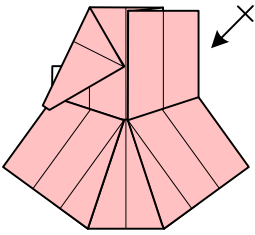
13. Turn the model over.



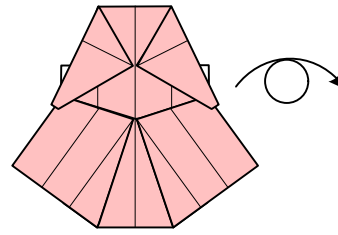
14. Fold and unfold the top edge down to the dotted line.



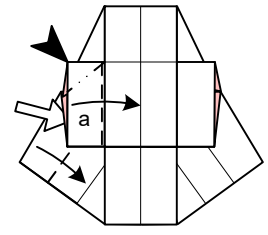
15. Fold down the single layer (left side) along the crease from step 14. As you do, open and squash the flap to the position in step 16.



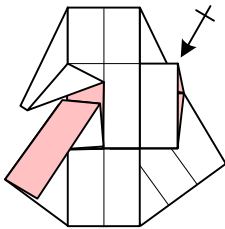
16. Repeat step 15 on the right.



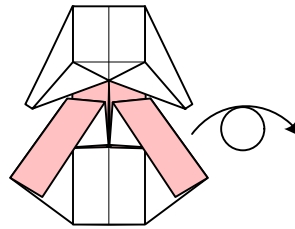
17. Turn the model over.



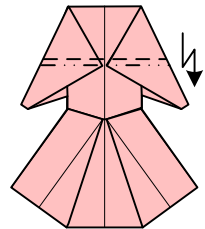
18. Fold the single layer (a) to the right and squash the upper corner. As you do so, restore the creases from step 11.



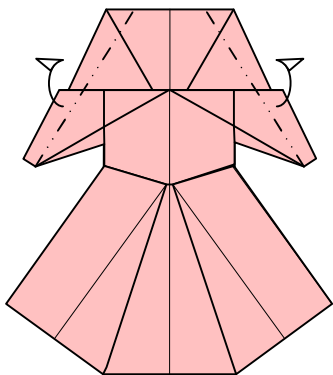
19. Repeat step 18 on the right.



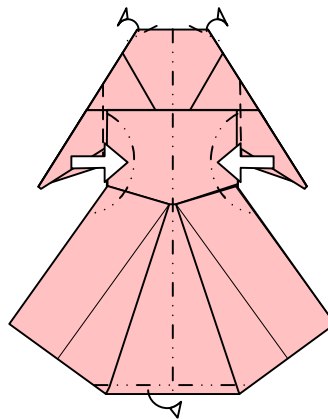
20. Turn the model over.



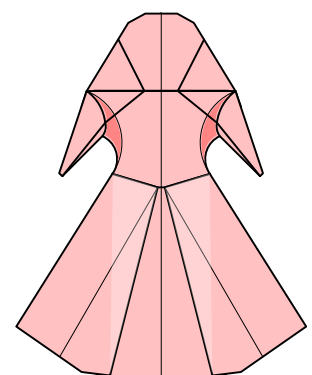
21. Pleat the model where indicated.



22. To shape the head and arms, mountain-fold the flaps on the left and right.



23. Shape the head with mountain folds. Shape the sides with curved mountain folds. Fold the arms inward. Mountain-fold the bottom edge a little to give the model more surface area for standing. Then mountain-fold the model in half slightly and stand it up.

If you hold the model up to the light, you'll see her legs behind the dress, as shown in the lightly shaded areas.
