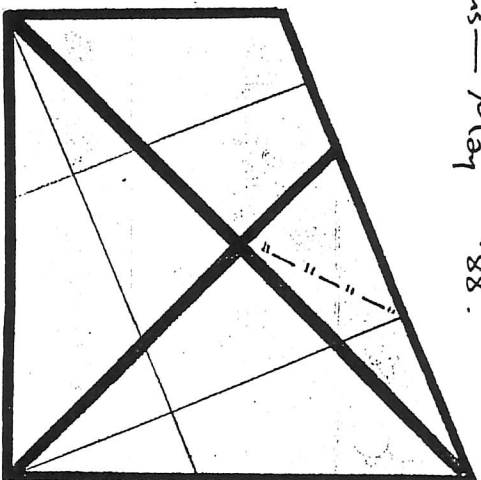
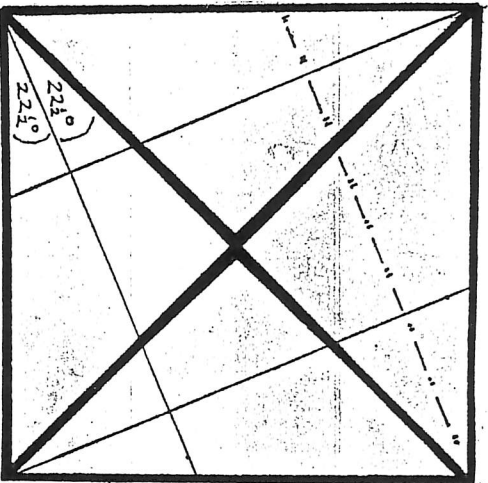


STAND

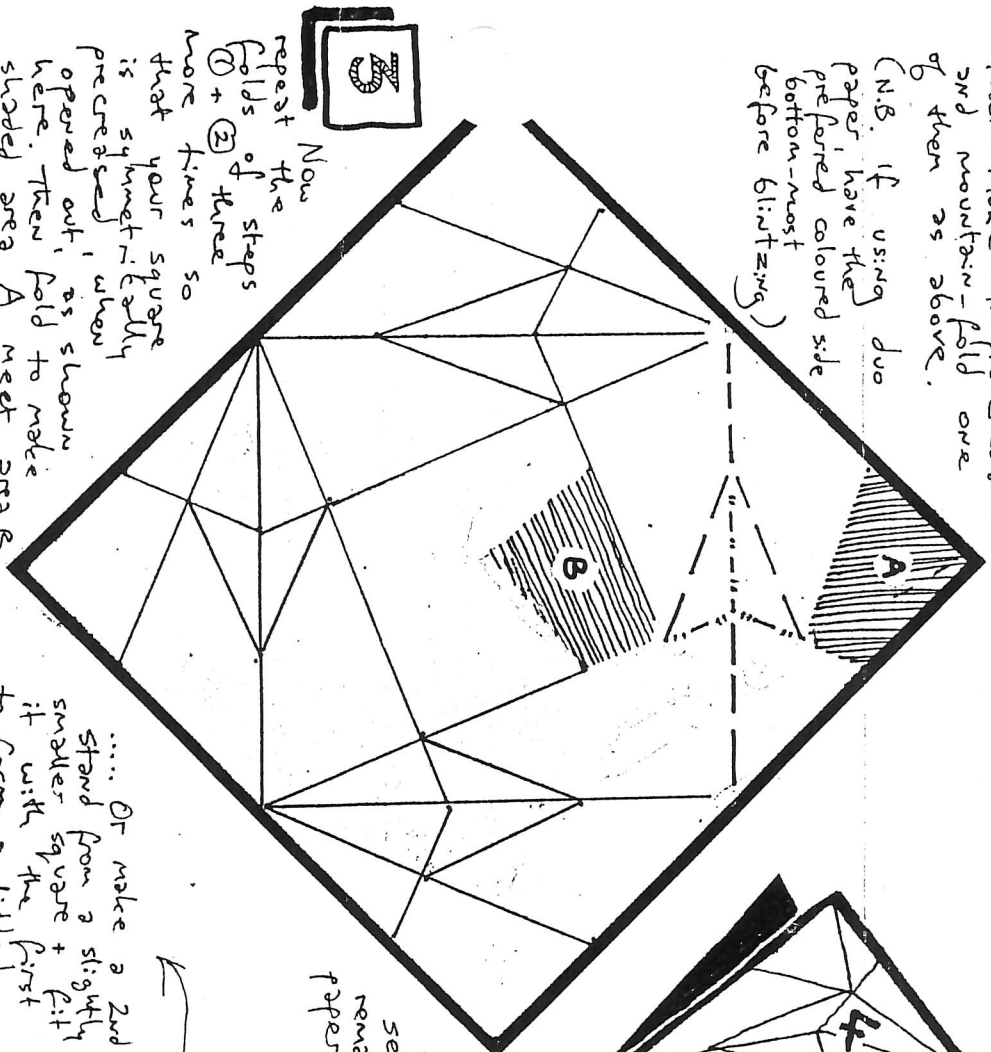
Method — November '87
Diagrams — May '88.



Choose paper of heavier weight. Locate centre and blintz-fold all corners as shown.

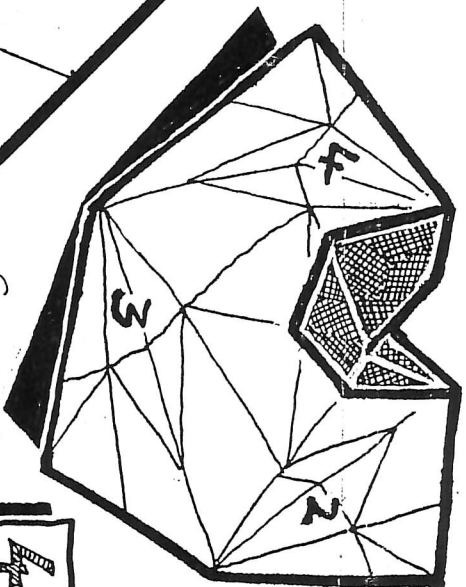
Then make 4 pre-creases and mountain-fold one of them as above.

(N.B. If using duo paper, have the pre-folded coloured side bottom-most before blintzing)



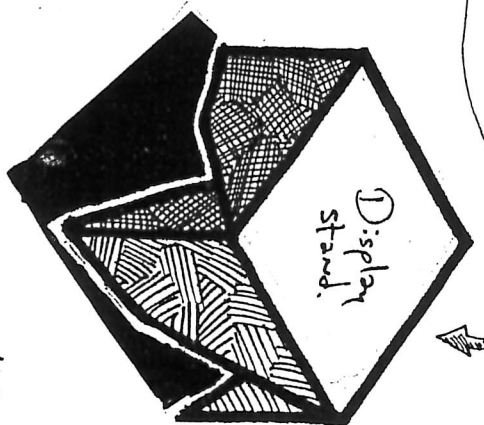
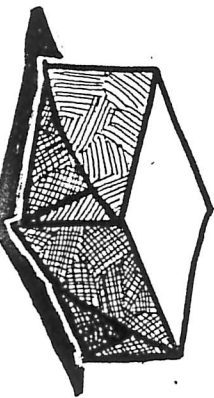
Now repeat the folds of steps ① + ② three or more times so that your square is symmetrically pre-creased, when opened out, as shown here. Then fold to make shaded area A next area B.

Now pre-crease here with a mountain-fold as shown. This also creases the layers folded in step ①.



Corner is now 3D (resembling a box corner). Then repeat step ③ fold sequence in each of the remaining quarters of your paper, 2, 3 + 4. is a completed stand when inverted.

..... Or make a 2nd stand from a slightly smaller square + fit it with the first to form a lidded container
