

TREES ON A HILLSIDE (Eric Kenneway)

Use a square of green paper, coloured side up. First mark the diagonal creases.

1 Fold the top right edge to the horizontal centre line.

2 Fold the top left edge to the horizontal centre line.

3 Mountain fold in half.

4 Pull out the concealed point at top. Inside reverse fold bottom point.

5 Inside reverse fold bottom point. Repeat behind.

6 Inside reverse fold top point. Repeat behind.

7 Squash fold uppermost layer at centre front.

8 Turn new flap inside out. To do this, open up the paper and alter the mountain fold edges of the flap into valley folds; then reform the model. Squash fold flap at left.

9 Turn this new flap inside out. Mountain fold lower edges of coloured flap to start forming tree.

10 Continue mountain folding edges of the coloured flaps to form trees.

11 The trees on a hillside completed. If you make several of these, varying the position and number of the trees, you can then fit them together to make a landscape frieze as a background for other models.
